Illinois Tax Scholarship Program You can attend St. Joseph Catholic School for FREE

Through the "Invest in Kids Act," Illinois children enrolled in private schools will have access to new scholarships. Spalding Scholarship Information

It is time to complete the John Lancaster Spalding Scholarship Fund Grants for the 2018-2019 school year. Tuition assistance scholarship grants are from the endowment fund, established as a result of the Diocese of Peoria ROOTED IN FAITH Campaign and named in honor of Archbishop Spalding, the first Bishop of Peoria. Grants will be available for the 2018-2019 school year for any students enrolled in or intending to enroll in a Catholic school located within the Diocese of Peoria whose families are members of a Catholic parish. All grants will be based on financial need objectively assessed. Information about the grants and application materials may be obtained from any Catholic elementary or secondary school in the Diocese of Peoria or on the Diocesan website www.cdop.org. Click on EDUCATION; then on OFFICE OF CATHOLIC SCHOOLS; and then on SPALDING SCHOLARSHIPS. Families of students currently receiving grants are reminded that all grants are for one year only and anyone seeking to renew a grant for 2018-2019 must reapply. The application deadline is April 15, 2018. Notification of grant awards will be made by mid-April. We will be hosting several training sessions for any families who would like to apply for a scholarship. St. Joseph Drop Off & Dismissal

To the Clergy, Consecrated, and Faithful Men and Women of the Diocese of Peoria:

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

I can still remember the very first Men's March - it was a cold, dreary spring day. I have to confess I didn't expect a very large turnout. Boy was I wrong! So many years later, the annual Men's March and Mass still packs the Cathedral. Maybe as a fruit of this annual gathering, many programs have taken root in our parishes to enhance the faith-life of our men. And yet our contemporary culture continues to attack the very definition of manhood. It is harder and harder to be a good man.

The Church has always looked to St. Joseph as a model for all men - for workers, for fathers, for husbands, and for priests. Parent's Corner

Advent is a time of preparation. It's a time for families to prepare spiritually for the celebration of Jesus' birth. Advent means "coming". It's the season for:

- ~ remembering Christ's birth
- ~ looking forward to celebrating Christ's presence among us at Christmas
- ~ reflecting on our lives and deepening our commitment to follow Christ
- ~ looking forward to Jesus coming again.

Advent begins on the 4th Sunday before Christmas Day and ends at sunset on Christmas Eve.



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The first week is for anticipation and longing for Jesus' coming.

It's a special time of watchful waiting. Here are some ideas to share with your family:

- ~ Light the first candle on your wreath together. Share the meaning with your children.
- ~ Read together from the Bible. Here are a few suggestions:

James 5: 7-8 Romans 13: 11-14 Matthew 24: 42-44 Mark 13: 32-37

- ~ Make a paper chain stating a short prayer, phrases about giving, hope or wish for the future, small drawing per strip
- ~ Make a crib together for Jesus. During Advent, have family members add a small piece of straw or yellow yarn for each good

deed they do to prepare a soft bed for Jesus

The second week is for preparing our hearts for Jesus

Now it's time to light two purple candles on your Advent wreath.

- ~ As you light the candles, tell stories that share the theme of giving.
- ~ Read together from the Bible. Here are a few suggestions:

1 Thessalonians 5:19 – 23 Romans 13:11-14 Matthew 3:1-11 Isaiah 11:1-10

~ Write family Advent letters instead of buying traditional cards

The third week is for rejoicing

It is the week for celebrating in anticipation of Christmas.

Now is the time to light two purple candles and the rose-colored candle

on your Advent wreath.

~ Read together from the Bible. Select another Bible reading to share with your family. Here a few suggestions:

Isaiah 35:1-2, 10 Psalm 122: 1-2 Philippians 4:4-7

- ~ Perform a family play. Have family members enact the story of Jesus' birth based on Luke 2:1-20. You can use old clothes or extra fabric for costumes.
- ~ Make a scrapbook for Advent memories.

Sing and learn a new song together. Here are a few suggestions: "O Come, Divine Messiah," "Come, Thou Long Expected Jesus"

~As you light the candles, tell how you and your family can show

their love for one another. Have each family member give at least one idea.

- ~ Share your hopes for the coming year.
- ~ Cut back on how much time your family spends watching TV or using the computer. Use the time to play games and do other Advent related activities such as:
- Advent Treasure Hunt
- Advent Charades
- Advent Spelling Bee
- ~ Read together from the Bible. Here are a few suggestions:

Luke 1:26 – 31 Psalms 121

Matthew 1:23, 11:28 - 30 Philippians 1:9 - 11



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The fourth week is for God's love and hope.

Christmas is almost here!

Now it's time to light all three purple candles and the rose candle on your Advent wreath.

Add a white candle to the center of your wreath. Make Christmas cards. Let children include drawings or messages, too.

- ~ Set a place for Jesus. At dinnertime, set an extra place to remind children that Christ is always with us.
- ~ There are many ways for your family to prepare for Advent. Here are a few suggestions as we begin preparing for Advent.
- ~ Make an Advent wreath with your family. Share the meaning of the wreath as it symbolizes the period of waiting for Jesus' coming.
- ~ Make an Advent calendar together. Then enjoy opening a door a day and sharing what lies behind the door.
- ~ Decorate your home for Advent. Use this time to be with your family members and explain the different symbols of the holiday.

Planning how to celebrate Christmas Eve

There are lots of ways to celebrate together. Here a few ideas:

- ~ Plan to attend church services
- ~ Place Jesus in the manger to complete the Nativity scene.
- ~ Light all the candles on the Advent wreath, including the white candle. As you light them, remind your family members what each one represents.
