## Extra-Curricular News

### Practice Reminders...

This is just a friendly reminder to all families; the only people who should be attending extra-curricular practices are those players who are listed on the roster and their coaches/teachers. Any other student from St Joseph School and/or another school should not be at any practices. The practice times are designated to those individuals to grow and participate within their activity.

#### Eligibility...

As our extra-curricular activities begin and eligibility is being looked at, a few items need to be clarified. Eligibility is pulled every Monday morning. The report looks at the student's grades from the previous week's work. The eligibility runs for one week beginning on that Monday through Sunday. Every Monday, eligibility is reevaluated and the principal notifies students if they have a warning or are ineligible. A letter is emailed home to the child's parents to be signed. If a child has a "D" in a class, they are on warning, which means they may play and practice for that week, but need to seek help from their teacher within that subject area. If a child has an "F" in a class, they are ineligible to play or practice for the week and need to seek help from their teacher within that subject area. If you have any questions regarding eligibility, please contact your child's teacher.

#### Volunteer Requirements

The Diocese of Peoria has many policies in place in order to provide safety for all the children in our care. If you want to volunteer or help out in the school setting, even just one time, you must complete the four components listed below:

1) Attend a "Safe Environment" workshop held with the St. Joseph Community.

("Safe Environment" used to be called "Protecting God's Children". If you participated in "Protecting God's Children" you will not have to take "Safe Environment")

2) Complete a form to have the Department of Children and Family Services do a background check. Just stop in the office and we will give you the form to complete and return to the office. The forms must be sent in from the office and returned to the office to be valid. There is no cost for this section.

3) Be fingerprinted by the Illinois State Police. Part of your registration fee pays for this process. You may schedule an appointment with the Tazewell County Police Station for any Thursday evening. Please make sure you take the form from the office to the appointment.

4) Complete the three driving courses on the Catholic Mutual website and turn in the certificates to the school office. There is no cost for this section.

Before you can volunteer or help in any capacity this school year, you must first have all components. We go through this whole process because the children are our most valuable assets in the school. Thank you for volunteering your time!

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### Parent's Corner Conversations About School

When you think of parent involvement, do you picture moms and dads volunteering in classrooms? That's one way to help – but research shows that supporting your child's education at home is even more important. Here are four conversations that will help you stay involved!

#### "Let's see what you brought home."

Look at completed work to find out what your child is learning and how well they are doing. You could comment on their social studies report or pottery project, for instance. ("You know a lot about our state's history!") Also, respond to notes from your child's teacher, and sign their weekly folder or daily planner if required.

#### "Show me what you have for homework."


It's your child's job to do their homework, but you play a role, too. Make sure your child knows what they are supposed to do by having them explain the assignments to you. After they finish their work, glance over the work to see that it's complete.

#### "Describe a book you enjoyed today."

This gives you an idea of what your child prefers to read. Then, build a daily reading habit by asking what they would like to read tonight. Encourage your child's reading and listening skills by reading aloud to them and letting your child read to you.

### "Tell me what you learned that you'd like to know more about."

Use your child's interests as jumping-off points for activities to share. If they like geometry, you might do tangrams together. If your child is fascinated by how animals adapt to winter, take them to the library to research the subject or to the zoo to see live animals.
